Thanks to personal arrangements and compositions, AUREUM manages to create a distinctive sound. With virtuosic expertise, the ensemble extracts tones, colors and sounds from the saxophones, creating an extraordinary auditory experience.

The four musicians have the ability to present music on stage in a unique way. To accomplish this, they have enlisted the renowned choreographer and director Ferdinando Chefalo. With incomparable wit and charm, situational scenography, and impeccable timing, AUREUM challenges the usual concert norms and offers a complete experience for its audience.

"A gnome?! Can that be true?"


"But gnomes don't even exist!"

Internationaler Cibulka Wettbewerb 2019, and CARSA Casinos Austria Rising Star Award 2018. They are also part of concert series and programs such as Jeunesse, Musica Juventutis, Imperial Talents, Live Music Now, Beyond Talents, ECMA European Chamber Music Academy, and NASOM The New Austrian Sound of Music.

AUREUM has performed at festivals such as the Istanbul Music Festival, Sonusiade - Museum Liaunig, Salzkammergut Festwochen, Haydn Region Festival, Klaaspärlimäng Festival in Estonia, and Tra Lago e Monti Festival in Italy. The music education project #klanginsel, titled "Mach dir ein Bild vom Klang" (Create an Image of Sound), was the result of a successful collaboration with the Tonkünstler Orchester NÖ.
